In House Judiciary. 2 nd reading on floor 3/18.	would require employees of state agencies who receive federal funding to report information to ICE about individuals they suspect to be undocumented. This would bill would ultimately heighten racial profiling, sow mistrust in our communities, and put our neighbors and ag workers at risk of deportation; would force local law enforcement agencies to enforce federal immigration laws which exposes them to expensive lawsuits in cases of constitutional violations.

Signed by Governor 4/8.	clarifies eligibility for tax credits for folks selling their "agricultural assets" to beginning farmers (e.g. land, equipment, etc.); makes it clear that immediate family members can't get this tax credit
Support	Healthy Food Access	HR 99	M. Dossett	Adopted by voice vote 3/26.	recognizes the importance of access to safe, affordable, culturally appropriate, and nutritious food and its beneficial impacts on the health of Kentuckians and Kentucky's agricultural economy.
Support	Farm Business	SB 103	M. Castlen, P. Hornback	Passed out of Senate. Passed out of House with amendments, sent back to Senate 4/15.	reduces minimum acreage to be called a farmstead from 10 acres to 5 acres which frees up smaller farmers to do their own on-site plumbing work instead of paying for professional services. Septic tanks still require inspection so there is no added risk to waterways.
